Subject:- Problems being faced by Indian SMEs in the context of REACH registration deadline for 2018

The Department of Chemicals & Petrochemicals has received representations from Chemical Industry Associations regarding the problems faced by exporters of Indian Small and Medium-sized Enterprises (SMEs) in the context of REACH registration deadline for 2018 due to the high cost of Letter of Access (LOA). The matter was taken up with European Chemical Agency (ECHA) in January, 2018 with a request to provide necessary support so that SMEs from India are not deprived of opportunity from registering their products due to high LOA cost.

In a letter jointly signed by Mr Daniel Calleja, DG Environment and Ms Lowri Evans, DG for Internal Market, Industry, Enterprise and SMEs of the European Commission addressed to our Ambassador, the Director Generals reminded that after 31 May 2018, substances exported to the EU in quantities reaching one tons or more per year per importer, that are not registered with the European Chemicals Agency (ECHA) can no longer be placed on the EU market. The objective was to draw India's attention on this deadline and that from 1 June 2018, only substances that have a valid registration will be allowed on the EU market.

- Regarding the deadline, ECHA has also been reminding many times. In April 2017, they reminded this date and the same 2. was communicated to DoC and CHEMEXCIL. The Mission also stressed the importance of this deadline to the DoC.
- It is requested, the DoC may request CHEMEXCIL to give wide publicity on the deadline issued by the EU. The ECHA's website contains extensive information on REACH and other EU chemical legislation.
- Please refer to our earlier e-mail dated 18 May 2016, we suggested that it would be better to have a kind of MoU with ECHA as the ECHA is the EU's specialised agency in charge of industrial chemical issues. DoC may highlight this with the Department of Chemicals as engagement with the ECHA would be in our chemical exporters' interests.

Dear Mr Biswas,

Thank you for your letter of 31 January 2018, referring to Mr Kapoor's letter of 10 January 2018.

Mr Hansen has asked me as the Head of Unit, Substance Identification and Data Sharing, which is dealing with questions on data and cost-sharing as well as with the dispute procedure, to reply to your letter.

As you may be aware, during the main annual REACH-related conference hosted by ECHA, the 2018 "Stakeholder Day", representatives of both Sustainability Support Services (Europe) AB and REACH Law held discussions with ECHA. We would also like to inform you that an additional meeting with representatives from Chemexcil is foreseen in the coming month, to discuss in person the concerns raised in Mr Kapoor's message.

On a general level, we would like to assure you that ECHA takes the concerns especially of small operators in the European market very serious. The challenges described in your letters are shared by SMEs not only from India but also the EU and other non-EU countries. ECHA aims to ensure that all operators are treated equally regardless of their origin, and in accordance with the principles defined by the REACH Regulation.

Further, we would like to recall that the REACH Regulation foresees a very clear – and in some respects limited – role for ECHA in terms of data and cost sharing. These obligations are primarily under industry responsibility; REACH does not foresee an active involvement of ECHA in these matters. This is reflected in the information and advice published by ECHA on its web pages, which aim to support registrants in their data-sharing negotiations and in fulfilling their legal obligation. However, ECHA cannot take position on individual cases or cost sharing practices beyond such generic information.

Nevertheless, with the dispute mechanism ECHA may be called upon in case registrants are not able to reach an agreement on the fair, transparent and non-discriminatory agreement. This is to ensure that existing registrants cannot impose unjustified costs on other operators or prevent them from accessing the market.
