Subject:- Anti-dumping Investigation against Alleged Dumped import of Sulphonic Acid Originating in and/or Exported from China, India, Indonesia, Iran, South Korea and Taiwan

National Tariff Commission (the "Commission") Government of the Islamic Republic of Pakistan presents its compliments to the esteemed Embassy of the Republic of India in Islamabad and has the honour to invite its attention to this Commission's Note verbale of even No. dated October 19, 2016, notifying receipt of an antidumping application from Pakistan's domestic industry producing Sulphonic Acid.

In accordance with Section 23 of the Anti-dumping Duties Act, 2015 (the "Act"), the Commission has examined the accuracy and adequacy of the evidence provided in the application and has determined that there is sufficient evidence to justify the initiation of an antidumping investigation. The Commission has, therefore, decided to initiate an antidumping investigation against alleged dumping of Sulphonic Acid originating in and/or exported from the People's Republic of China, Republic of India, Republic of Indonesia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Republic of Korea and Taiwan (the "Exporting Countries"). The notice of initiation of the investigation has been published in the press and Official Gazette in Pakistan on November 28, 2016.

Article 12.1 of the Agreement on Implementation of Article VI of GATT 1994, and Section 27(1) of the Act requires the Commission to forward a copy of the notice of initiation to exporting country the product of which is subject to the investigation. Accordingly, a copy of the notice of initiation is attached. It is requested that the said notice may kindly be forwarded to all known exporters/producers of Sulphonic Acid in the Republic of India, as the addresses of all exporters/producers are not available with the Commission.

In accordance with Article 6.1.3 of the Agreement on Implementation of Article VI of GATT 1994, and Section 28 of the Act, a copy of full text of the written application (non-confidential) received from Pakistan's domestic industry under Section 20 of the Act and a copy of exporters/ foreign producers questionnaire for the purposes to gather information necessary for this investigation, are also enclosed. These documents will also be sent directly to the exporters/ foreign producers whose complete addresses are available with the Commission. However, you are

requested to kindly forward these documents to all known exporters/ foreign producers of Sulphonic Acid in the Republic of India, as the addresses of all exporters/ foreign producers are not available with the Commission.

Notice of Initiation of Anti-dumping Investigation Against Alleged Dumped Imports of Sulphonic Acid into Pakistan Originating in and/or Exported from China, India, Indonesia, Iran, South Korea and Taiwan

National Tariff Commission (the "Commission") has received an application under Sections 20 and 24 of the Anti-Dumping Duties Act, 2015 (the "Act") on October 14, 2016 from M/s. Tufail Chemical Industries Limited, Karachi (the "Applicant"). The Applicant is a producer of sulphonic Acid and has alleged that the sulphonic acid is being exported to Pakistan at dumped prices from the People's Republic of China, Republic of India, Republic of Indonesia, Islamic Republic of Iran, Republic of Korea and Taiwan (the "Exporting Countries"). It is further alleged that the imports of sulphonic acid from the Exporting Countries have caused and is threatening to cause material injury to the domestic industry producing sulphonic acid.

Upon initial examination and assessing accuracy of the evidence and information provided in application in accordance with Section 23 of the Act, the Commission is satisfied that the evidence and information provided in the application is sufficient to justify initiation of an investigation into the matter.

Initiation of Investigation: The Commission hereby initiates an investigation under Section 23 of the Act. The investigation will determine whether sulphonic acid originating in and/or exported from the Exporting Countries is being dumped into Pakistan and whether such dumping has caused or is threatening to cause material injury to the domestic industry of sulphonic acid. The Commission will, during the course of this investigation, call for any information/data deemed necessary for the purposes of this investigation.

Product under Investigation: The investigated product is Linear Alkyl Benzene Sulphonic Acid ("LABSA") imported from the Exporting Countries. It is classified under Pakistan Customs Tariff ("PCT") Heading No. 3402.1110. Investigated product is used in production of detergent powder, dish washing liquid and other industrial cleaning applications.

Period of Investigation ("POI"):

For determination of dumping: From July 01, 2015 to June 30, 2016
For determination of injury: From July 01, 2013 to June 30, 2016

Interested Parties: Interested parties, as defined in Section 2(j) of the Act, are requested to make themselves known to the Secretary, National Tariff Commission, State Life Building No. 5, Blue Area, Islamabad, Tel: +9251-9202839 Fax: +9251-9221205 not later than 10 days after the publication of this notice. An interested party applying for registration with the Commission in this investigation should submit: the name of the company, its line of business, name of authorized person, address, telephone number and fax number.

All interested parties are further invited to make their views/comments known to the Commission, and to submit information and documents (if any) not later than 45 days of the date of publication of this notice in the press in Pakistan.

Date of initiation of investigation:	The date of publication of this notice in the newspapers in Pakistan.
Date of preliminary determination:	Not earlier than 60 days and not later than 180 days from the date of initiation of the investigation.
Date of final determination:	Within 180 days of the preliminary determination.
Hearing:	Hearing shall be held not later than 60 days prior to the proposed date of final determination, upon request, if any, made within 30 days of the publication of notice of initiation
