BRIEF of BANGLADESH

The huge delta region formed at the confluence of the Ganges and Brahmaputra River systems - now referred to as Bangladesh - was a loosely incorporated outpost of various empires centered on the Gangetic plain for much of the first millennium A.D. Muslim conversions and settlement in the region began in the 10th century, primarily from Arab and Persian traders and preachers. Europeans established trading posts in the area in the 16th century. Eventually the area known as Bengal, primarily Hindu in the western section and mostly Muslim in the eastern half, became part of British India. Partition in 1947 resulted in an eastern wing of Pakistan in the Muslim - majority area, which became East Pakistan. Calls for greater autonomy and animosity between the eastern and western wings of Pakistan led to a Bengali independence movement. That movement, led by the Awami League (AL) and supported by India, won the independence war for Bangladesh in 1971.

The post-independence AL government faced daunting challenges and in 1975 was overthrown by the military, triggering a series of military coups that resulted in a military-backed government and subsequent creation of the Bangladesh Nationalist Party (BNP) in 1978. That government also ended in a coup in 1981, followed by military - backed rule until democratic elections occurred in 1991. The BNP and AL have alternated in power since 1991, with the exception of a military - backed, emergency caretaker regime that suspended parliamentary elections planned for January 2007 in an effort to reform the political system and root out corruption. That government returned the coun try to fully democratic rule in December 2008 with the election of the AL and Prime Minister Sheikh HASINA. In January 2014, the incumbent AL won the national election by an overwhelming majority after the BNP boycotted, extending HASINA's term as prime minister. In December 2018, HASINA secured a third consecutive term (fourth overall) with the Awami League coalition securing 96% of available seats, amid widespread claims of election irregularities. With the help of international development assistance, Bangladesh has reduced the poverty rate from over half of the population to less than a third, achieved Millennium Development Goals for maternal and child health, and made great progress in food security since independence. The economy has grown at an annual average of about 6% over the last two decades and the country reached World Bank lower-middle income status in 2014.





National Flag:-

The national flag of Bangladesh was adopted officially on 17 January 1972. It consists of a red disc on top of a green field. The red disc is offset slightly toward the hoist so that it appears centred when the flag is flying

National Emblem of Bangladesh:-



The national emblem of Bangladesh was adopted shortly after independence in 1971. Located on the emblem is a water lily, that is bordered on two sides by rice sheaves. Above the water lilly are four stars and three connected jute leaves.

National Anthem:-

ECONOMIC ANALYSIS

I. Background

- 1. Bangladesh has been showing strong growth performance with a gross domestic product (GDP) growth rate estimated to have exceeded 7% in FY2016, for the second time in the last three decades—driven on the supply side by services and rise in public investment and consumption expenditures on the demand side.1 With its vision to become a 'middle income' country by 2021, Bangladesh needs to steer the economy towards accelerated progress and achieve the required average GDP growth of 7.4% during the Seventh Five-Year Plan, FY2016– FY2020.2 As such, investment rate will need to expand from 28% in FY2015 to around 34% by FY2020. Much of this investment will need to enhance infrastructure, improve labor skills, and boost manufacturing production.
- 2. Public investment in infrastructure in Bangladesh has been low averaging only about 2% of GDP and the long years of underinvestment have left a large part of the country's population with poor access to basic infrastructure and services. The Global Competitiveness Report for 2014–2015 published by the World Economic Forum assigned Bangladesh an infrastructure ranking of 127 among 144 countries.3 Poor infrastructure is an obstacle to faster and more inclusive economic growth because it (i) reduces the incentives for domestic and foreign investment; and (ii) restricts the country's participation in South Asian regional trade, even though its strategic location makes it a potential regional transport and transshipment hub.4 The frequent power shortages affecting industrial output due to the nation's inadequate electricity infrastructure reduce GDP by an estimated 2% every year.5
- 3. To address these infrastructure deficiencies, the Seventh Five-Year Plan, FY2016– FY2020requires a total financing equivalent to around Tk31.9 trillion, which is almost twice the size of Bangladesh's GDP. Mobilizing financing from both the private and public sectors is critical to successfully accelerating investments in infrastructure. The government lacks the fiscal resources to finance the country's infrastructure development on its own, and meeting the five-year plan targets will require substantial investment and implementation input from the private sector through public–private partnerships (PPPs).

II. Infrastructure Financing in Bangladesh

- 4. Commercial banks act as an engine of growth in any economy, but in Bangladesh they have limited exposure to the infrastructure sector. As of the end of FY2012, only slightly more than 3% of the loans and advances by scheduled banks were in what could be considered infrastructure sectors.6 The banking sector's exposure norms and asset-liability structure generally limit banks from investing in infrastructure. Given that banks in Bangladesh are subject to existing single borrower exposure limit of 15% of total capital, it has been observed

BILATERAL RELATIONS BETWEEN INDIA AND BANGLADESH

India was the first country to recognize Bangladesh as a separate and independent state and established diplomatic relations with the country immediately after its independence in December 1971. The relationship between India and Bangladesh is anchored in history, culture, language and shared values of secularism, democracy, and countless other commonalities between the two countries. It is based on sovereignty, equality, trust, understanding and win-win partnership that goes far beyond a strategic partnership. In the last couple of years, the relationship has been further strengthened including through cooperation in new and high-technology areas.

High Level Visits and Exchanges There have been regular high-level visits and exchanges between the two countries. There have also been frequent visits at Ministerial level as well as between senior officials on a regular basis.

Bilateral Trade and Investment The first Trade Agreement between India and Bangladesh was signed in 1972. The India-Bangladesh Trade Agreement was last renewed in PM's visit in June 2015 for a period of 5 years with a provision for auto renewal. There are a number of other trade related agreements that have been signed between both countries. Bilateral trade between India and Bangladesh has grown steadily over the last decade. In the five years, total trade between the two countries has grown by more than 17%.India's exports to Bangladesh in the period July 2016 – March 2017 stood at US\$ 4489.30 million and imports from Bangladesh during FY 2016-17 stood at US\$ 672.40 million. More details on bilateral trade statistics are on the website of High Commission. India has provided duty free quota free access to Bangladesh on all tariff lines except tobacco and alcohol under South Asian Free Trade Area (SAFTA) since 2011. Four Border Haats, two each in Tripura and Meghalaya, have been established for the benefit of bordering communities. Additional Border Haats on the India-Bangladesh border are under consideration. Total Indian investment proposals in Bangladesh registered with the Bangladesh Investment Development Authority (BIDA) exceed US\$ 3billion. Indian Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) in Bangladesh reached US\$ 88.0million in 2015-16. During PM Sheikh Hasina's visit in April 2017, 13 agreements worth around US\$ 10 billion of mainly Indian investment in power and energy sectors in Bangladesh were signed.

India has extended 3 Lines of Credits to Bangladesh in the last 7 years amounting to US\$ 8 billion. This makes Bangladesh the largest recipient of LOC funds from India till date. During the visit of Bangladesh PM to India in January 2010, India had announced a US\$1 billion Line of Credit (LOC) for Bangladesh covering projects in public transportation, roads, railways, bridges and inland waterways etc. Most of these projects have been completed and the remaining areat various stages of completion. India had extended the second LOC of US\$ 2 billion during the visit of Prime Minister Modi to Bangladesh in June 2015. This LOC covers 15 projects in areas of Roads, Railways, Power, Shipping, SEZs, Health & Medical Care and Technical Education. During the visit of Bangladesh PM to India in April 2017, India extended a third LOC of US\$ 4.5 billion to Bangladesh. The new LOC will cover projects in areas of Port. Construction, Railways, Roads, Airports, Power & Energy, Telecommunications, and Shipping etc. In addition to LOC funds, Government of India also providesgrant assistance to Bangladesh for projects under 'Aid to Bangladesh'. Projects such as construction of school/college buildings, laboratories, dispensaries, deep tube wells, community centres, renovation of historical monuments/buildings etc have been financed by Government of India under this programme. At present, three Sustainable Development Projects (SDPs) are being undertaken in the cities of Rajshahi, Khulna and Sylhet. The extended development work of RabindraNath Tagore's ancestral house in Shilaidaha is as well as 36 community clinics in selected districts of Bangladeshis also being undertaken. One of the biggest projects under the Indian grant assistance is the Bangladesh section of the Agartala-Akhaura rail-link.


