Overall Trade Snapshot

Chemicals & Petrochemicals trade:

India's exports: \$720M (3% of EFTA's \$28.99B imports in this segment).

Share in India's world exports of chemicals: 1.5% only (out of India's \$47.5B chemical exports).

Country-wise Dynamics

Switzerland

- India's total exports: \$1.51B | Imports: \$21.52B (driven by gold/metals).
- Chemicals & Petrochemicals exports: \$628M vs Swiss imports of \$20.05B ⇒ India's share: ~3%.
- Also, India received an FDI of USD 12.96 million in 2024-25 out of which around 10.23 million USD is contributed in Manufacturing of Basic Chemicals. Thus, indicating the investment and JV opportunity for India with Switzerland.
- Key sectors:
 - Inorganic chemicals (HS 29): India exports \$597M vs Swiss imports $\$8.1B \Rightarrow 7.4\%$ share.
 - Organic chemicals (HS 28): \$8.34M vs imports \$774M \Rightarrow ~1.1%.
 - Plastics (HS 39): \$2.65M vs \$7.6B imports \Rightarrow near-zero share (<0.05%).

- India's total exports: \$424M | Imports: \$934M.
- Chemicals & Petrochemicals exports: \$86.5M vs Norway's \$7.69B imports ⇒ just 1.1% share.
- Key sectors:
 - o **Inorganic chemicals (HS 29):** \$79.3M vs \$1.03B imports ⇒ **7.7% share** (solid presence).
 - Plastics (HS 39): \$5.05M vs \$2.7B imports \Rightarrow 0.2% share.

- India's total exports: \$12.4M | Imports: \$11.4M.
- Chemicals & Petrochemicals exports: \$5.4M vs Iceland's \$1.25B imports ⇒ 0.4% share.
- Key sectors:
 - Inorganic chemicals (HS 29): \$5.03M vs \$21.2M imports ⇒ 23.7% share (India already strong).
 - Plastics (HS 39): $$0.38M \text{ vs } $266M \text{ imports} \Rightarrow 0.14\% \text{ share}.$

Opportunities for India's Chemicals & Petrochemicals Exports to EFTA

1. Switzerland

- Switzerland's Total imports of Chemicals & Petrochemicals: USD 20.05 billion.
- India's exports to Switzerland: USD 628 million (3% share).
- Switzerland's major suppliers: Germany (28%), China (14%), Italy (9%), USA (7%).

Opportunity:

- India already has a foothold (6th largest supplier) but can expand by targeting high-value segments like inorganic chemicals, agrochemicals, specialty chemicals, and plastics.
- Import reliance on Germany & China provides room for diversification of supply sources.

 With EFTA-India TEPA signed, tariff concessions can enhance India's competitiveness vis-à-vis EU suppliers.

2. Norway

- Norway's Total imports of Chemicals & Petrochemicals: USD 7.69 billion.
- India's exports to Norway: USD 86.46 million
- Major suppliers: Brazil (13%), Germany (11%), USA (11%), Sweden (10%).
- Opportunity:
 - India's presence is limited; potential to climb up supplier ranks by tapping pharmaceutical intermediates, agrochemicals, plastics, and organic chemicals.
 - Strong potential for import substitution as top exporters are geographically distant (Brazil, USA).
 - Growth areas include **green/eco-friendly chemicals** aligning with Norway's sustainability agenda.

3. Iceland

- Iceland's Total imports of Chemicals & Petrochemicals: USD 1.25 billion.
- India's exports to Iceland: USD 5.42 million
- Major suppliers: Brazil (25%), Australia (17%), Jamaica (12%), Germany (6%).

- Opportunity:
 - Very low penetration of India; scope to expand in specialty chemicals, agrochemicals, plastics, and pharmaceutical products.
 - Heavy dependence on distant suppliers (Brazil, Australia,) indicates opportunity for India to emerge as a **cost-effective and reliable alternative**.
